Speaker: Ray Barkalow, First Rays Orchids, Doylestown, PA

Topic: Semi-Hydroponic Orchid Culture

Ray Barkalow has been growing orchids since 1973, having been given a cattleya by a grower at the public greenhouses in Atlanta's Piedmont Park (now the Atlanta Botanical Gardens) while in grad school at Georgia Tech. Over the years he expanded his collection through purchases, trades, and the collection of plants in South America, Southeast Asia and China while on business trips.

In January of 1994, he experienced a total loss due to a heater AND alarm failure on a seven-degree night. After that devastating "winter of the ice," he

bought a new heater and alarm system, followed by a few plants. After dividing them some time later, it occurred to him that by selling the divisions to other hobby growers, he could get some cash to buy more plants, and selling divisions of those would lead to more, and so on. So, he posted a text-only list on the web, and within three hours had two orders. That was the beginning of First Ray's Orchids!

As the originator and developer of the Semi-Hydroponic culture technique for orchid growing, and with over

20 years' experience with it - 40 growing orchids -Ray has received many requests to speak with orchid societies about Semi-Hydroponics.
