

# Carson Barnes: Not your grandpappy's Vandas

Carson began growing orchids 50 years ago, and became interested in Vandas around the turn of the century, though it was one of the native ladyslippers that first bit him. He quickly found that he lived about eleven miles from Merritt Huntington and Kensington Orchids, who had just started importing interesting species while maintaining several houses of Cattleya hybrids for cut flowers. Carson worked for Rod McLellan in South San Francisco as their wholesale guy in the 1990s, and then went into business for himself. He's now done with all that. Carson is an accredited American Orchid Society judge, and from years of picking out one flower slightly better than the rest, he has had upwards of 50 plants awarded. His orchid collection is a rambunctious mix of all sorts of species and hybrids, some difficult and some easy to grow, of varying requirements. Carson and his wife moved to Georgia from the San Francisco Bay area in 2012 and are starting to settle in comfortably.

Carson will talk about some new *Vanda* breeding lines as well as some that are lesser known, in part due to a quarter of the species of *Vanda* being described in the last 40 or so years.
